WATERCOLOR CLASS - Over the past years, various members of St. Margaret's have inquired as to whether I would teach a watercolor class. I talked with Hazel and have agreed to do so in the Parish Hall on Wednesdays from 1:30 to 3:30 PM. The class will start on September 7th and continue until November 16. The cost will be \$200.00 for the eleven weeks, with 1/2 of the money going to St. Margaret's Outreach. Assuming you have absolutely nothing, the initial supplies will be around \$75.00. We will need a minimum of ten people to have a nice exchange of ideas and support among each other, as well as making it worth taking my time out of my own painting. Since Hazel has said she will be a member of the class, we need nine others.

No prior experience in painting is necessary, as I will start with the very basics. If you have prior painting experience, I will start with where you are as a watercolor painter. You will learn something about technique, color, composition, and a little drawing. You will be expected to think creatively, and to do some work outside of class. However, it will not be as rigorous as a university painting class. I will try my best to be as mellow as I can.

We will endeavor to have each participant create at least one watercolor he or she will be proud to have matted, framed and hung in their home."

Sunday School News

Open House August 29th, 10:15 am
Classes begin Sunday, September 11th, 10:05 am

We are blessed as a parish family to have a particularly wonderful group of parishioners signed up to work with our children and youth in Sunday School this year. Each class has a teaching team of four in place, to insure that there are always two adults in each classroom on Sunday mornings. All of our classes are using carefully chosen Episcopal curriculums.

Things parents and students should know about Sunday School:

- Class begins at 10:05 am and concludes at 10:50.
- Parents are asked to drop off and pick up children promptly so that the short 45 minute session can get started quickly and that teachers who attend the 11 am Eucharist are able to make it to worship on time.
- Parents are asked to stay at church during the Sunday School hour so that they are available in case of emergency. St. Margaret's has two adult education offerings every week. The Rectors Forum meets in the Gable House and the Adult Sunday School class meets in the Rose Parish Hall. An informal Coffee hour takes place in the kitchen as well.
- All students are asked to contribute a box of snacks and drinks to their Sunday school class cupboard at the beginning of the year. Please send individually wrapped NUT and PEANUT free snacks with your child on the first day of class.
- The primary goal of all of our Sunday School classes is to make sure all of our students know and love God, and that God loves them.

Godly Play was written by Episcopal priest, author and teacher Rev. Dr. Jerome Berryman based on the work of Maria Montessori, whom he studied with in Italy. It is a wonder-filled journey that encourages young children to enter our religious language – parable, sacred story, liturgical action and silence– to help them become more fully aware of God's presence in their daily lives. It finds its roots in oral storytelling and the Holy Eucharist itself. The format of the class follows that of our Sunday morning worship: getting ready, listening to and responding to the Word (Scripture readings), the feast (Holy Communion), Prayers of Thanksgiving, and Blessing (saying goodbye).

All Things New uses a rich mixture of age appropriate activities centered on scripture and Christian "basics". Music, prayer, fine art reproductions and take home papers reinforce the week's lesson. Students get hands on experience when they look up weekly scripture texts in the Bible, even exploring multiple translations of the same text. They also learn more about prayer by writing their own individually and as a group. The format of the class is similar to that used in Godly Play – Opening, tell the story, respond to the story and close.

Journey to Adulthood is a complete youth ministry program of spiritual formation for 6th-12th grades. It uses Bible study, prayer, rites of passage, outreach ministries and both serious and playful activities to underscore its two guiding principles:

1. Manhood and womanhood are free gifts from God.
2. Adulthood must be earned.

There are three two-year segments of the program:

Rite-13: The first two years (6th & 7th or 7th & 8th graders) that focus on celebrating the individuality of each young person and their creative potential. The Rite-13 liturgy (A celebration of Manhood and Womanhood) is the community expression of this and a rite of passage from childhood towards adulthood.

J2A: The middle portion of the program (8th & 9th or 9th and 10th graders), engages youth with the skills and critical thinking involved in adulthood. The youth plan and embark on a pilgrimage together at the end of this segment. This experience is often the spiritual highlight of their youth.

YEA: This is a mentor-based program that helps older teens (10th, 11th and 12th graders) discern and carry out a ministry within their church or in the larger community. Vocation and development of a personal credo are also emphasized. A final rite of passage sends them out into the world as ambassadors of Christ.
