

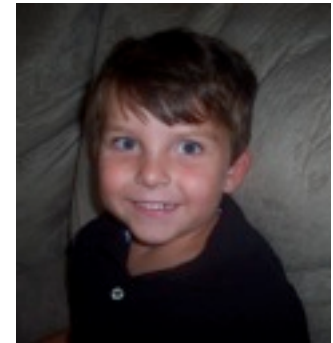


St Margaret's Notebook



We are so excited to again be bringing a Great Strides walk to the University of West Georgia Campus on September 11, 2010. For the second year, the Rotary Clubs of West Georgia have taken the walk on as one of their fundraising projects. After the success of last year's walk, which raised over \$50,000, we are very optimistic for another wonderful walk. We are thrilled about this venture for our family and for the many others with CF!

Ramsey has had another wonderful year!! He is gaining weight, growing, and still being such a trooper with all of his treatments. He has gotten stellar check ups each time we go to Scottish Rite. We are fighting this disease each day to keep him healthy and the payoff is seeing a thriving, active young boy.



The CF Foundation feels very optimistic that they are so close, within the next 5 to 10 years, either to finding a cure or to the development and approval of new drugs that will help the underlying defect so the disease will no longer be life threatening. Hopefully soon CF will be a disease that is treatable like asthma. Imagine a pill that doesn't just turn off the symptoms of CF-it attacks the disease at its very core. That is what scientists and clinicians, supported by the CF Foundation, are now working to develop. Of course we are ecstatic about this prospect and know that the one thing they need is money to keep the research coming along for the cure to be found. The Cystic Fibrosis Foundation receives no federal money; everything they get is from private donors or corporations who all work together to make the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation. We truly rely on our friends and family to help support our cause and get more money for more research so these milestones may be met sooner rather than later.

The first ever West Georgia Great Strides walk raised over \$50,000 last year! We are humbled by the success of the first walk, but still want to set our goal higher this year and try to reach \$60,000. We feel so fortunate and blessed to have this community and Rotary help us in this collaborative effort.

Sanctuary Floors to be Refinished

The Vestry unanimously approved a 'dream wall' item from its retreat, to refinish the floors in the sanctuary and choir areas. The work will begin immediately following services on Sunday, August 15th. Because it will take a full week for the refinishing process, we will not have access to either the sanctuary or choir loft. Morning prayer on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday (Aug. 17, 18, and 19) and the Wednesday noonday intercessory prayer service and the 12:15 service (Aug. 18) will be canceled. Everything should be finished and back in place in time for our regular Sunday services on August 22.

Acolyte Training will be held between the services on August 15. If you would like to be a Taperer, Bookbearer, or Crucifer please plan to attend this training.

Remember:

You must be 8 years old to be a taperer.

You must be 10 years old to be a bookbearer - please note that until you are 12 you still may be called upon to taper.

You must be 14 years old to be a crucifer - please note that until you are 16 you will be asked to bookbear and crucifer.

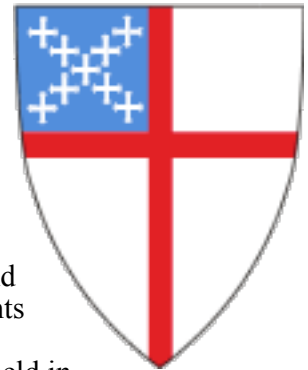
WE NEED YOUR HELP!!

EPISCOPALIANS TO GATHER HONORING SLAIN VOTING RIGHTS ADVOCATE

The 12th annual pilgrimage honoring slain civil rights advocate Jonathan Myrick Daniels and others who lost their lives during the 1960s struggle for voting rights, is scheduled Saturday, Aug. 14, in Hayneville, Ala. A contingent from the Diocese of Atlanta participates annually. This year the Rev. Barry Griffin will lead a group from St. Augustine's Episcopal Church, Morrow, and members of St. John's, East Point, will travel there as well. The pilgrimage begins at 11 a.m. Central Time at the Courthouse Square in Hayneville. The procession will go to the old county jail where Daniels and Sales were among those detained for a week and then will move to the old Cash Grocery Store where Daniels was killed. The pilgrimage will end at the Courthouse where a service of Holy Communion will take place in the courtroom where the man who killed Daniels was tried and acquitted.
