



From the Rector

In the late 1970s, the Episcopal Church put out a series of ads.

One ad had an image of a Sony television set up for communion:
a piece of linen, chalice, paten, bread and wine.

The caption read, "Have you ever seen a Sony that gives Holy Communion?"

That ad surfaces in my mind as I reflect on the life and legacy of Marion Hatchett

I was one of those seminary students who had the luxury of studying Liturgics
under him during his 35 year tenure as professor.

Even seminarians who did not go to Sewanee knew and read
the works of this leading liturgical scholars of our time.

The dean of the School of Theology enumerated his accomplishments in
an email to alumni and students.

In addition to training generations of Episcopal clergy, he served from 1973-1976 on the drafting committees that produced the 1979 Book of Common Prayer and on the Standing Liturgical Commission from 1976-1982. He was convener and chair of the ecumenical committee that produced the Common Eucharistic Prayer, included in the 1979 Book of Common Prayer as Eucharistic Prayer D. He chaired the committee that produced the first Book of Occasional Services (1979). He served on the Standing Commission on Church Music from 1973-1985, chairing the text committee for The Hymnal 1982.

Marion was an academic.

He wrote thirteen books and numerous articles on the history and practice of
liturgy and church music.

He knew the argument and rationale behind every word and rubric
in the Book of Common Prayer. I often think of him when I am
leading the liturgy on Sunday morning.

Yet, the value of what Marion gave me has little to do
with rules of kneeling and standing.

He modeled for us all a deep respect for the mystery of God's love
which seeps into our souls and hearts as we pray week after week
"Almighty God, to you all hearts are open, all desires known,
and from you no secrets are hid."

Through the words of the liturgy, we know ourselves
to be surrounded by the communion of saints
-"angels and archangels and all the company of heaven."

The title of one of Marion's books, *Sanctifying Life, Time and Space*,
says it all.
