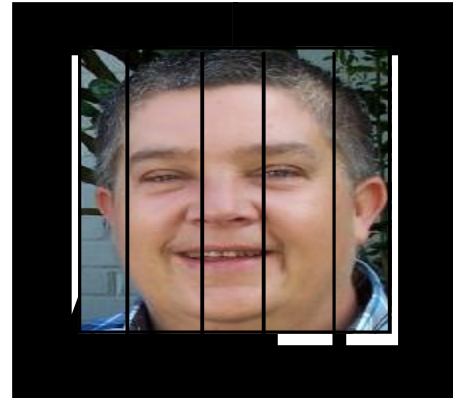

ST. MARGARET'S COMMUNITY OUTREACH 2008 ANNUAL REPORT

I have always referred to St. Margaret's Community Outreach (SMCO) as a "holy intersection" ... that place where need meets blessing which answers that need. However, it seems our little "holy intersection" has grown into a full-fledged super-highway "spaghetti junction." The flow of need through our little office stays constant through the year. During 2008, especially the final weeks of the year, the normal flow "accelerated" to unbelievable speed and volume. SMCO directed the increased flow without collision. Volunteers in all shapes and sizes, from St. Margaret's and beyond, stepped up the patrol to cover the volume. Monetary and in-kind donations, from our own members and our community friends, materialized. Still, year-end tallies show decreases in numbers served from 2007, even in the face of increased expenditures. Simply put, costs of services increased in 2008 over 2007. Economic forecasts for 2009 are gloomy. The super-highway of need of 2008 will surely continue. SMCO intends to "keep pace" as best we can, directing available resources to help our friends in need, maintaining current programs and services, developing new programs and alliances, and keeping the component of "community" alive and well in the continued pursuit of our mission of serving the poor and disadvantaged. Buckle up, friends; we aren't there yet.
