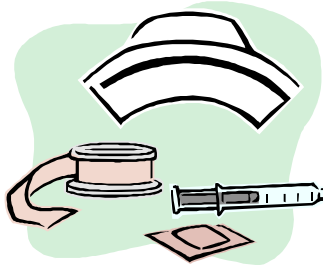
Who is a parish nurse (faith community nurse/congregational)?

A parish nurse (PN) is a registered nurse with a minimum of 2 years experience that works in a faith community to address health issues of its members and other members in the broader community or neighborhood. The experience the nurse has gathered working in other medical areas / specialties aids the nurse with assessment of health status, health needs, and collaboration with health agencies. What makes this specialty different is the conscious partnering of health issues with the faith of the client and client's family. The core to this practice is the intentional care of the spirit of those the PN assists.

What does a parish nurse do?

A parish nurse seeks to foster physical, emotional, spiritual, and social harmony leading to healthy and healing relationships with God, family, faith communities, culture and creation. They have several roles:

- **H** – Health advisor- Available to answer questions about medications, treatments, procedures, disease processes, etc.
- **E** – Educator on health issues- The nurse provides resources to educate the congregation and community on ways to stay healthy. The nurse has the resource of expert speakers, the printed information, and continues to add to her personal knowledge of the latest health care issues and makes these available to the faith community.
- **A** – Advocate/resource person
- **L** – Liaison to faith & community resources- The nurse knows the local resources and physicians and assists the congregation and others in knowing when to go to the doctor, what resources are available to assist them in self- care, how to get assistance in paying for health care and how to walk through the complicated maze of managed care.
- **T** – Teacher of volunteers & developer of support groups- The nurse helps identify and train volunteers to lead support groups, to assist with care, to assist with screening and use their gifts and training in an “whole-istic” way that expands the faith community’s ministry and honors God.
- **H** – Healer of body, mind, spirit, and community- The nurse may counsel a young, pregnant teenager and her parents, help people take their medicines correctly, assist an elderly person to make changes that will allow him to stay in his home, answer questions about upcoming treatment, visit those discharged from the hospital to assist in the adjustment, help a new mother understand self-care and child care or meet many other needs.

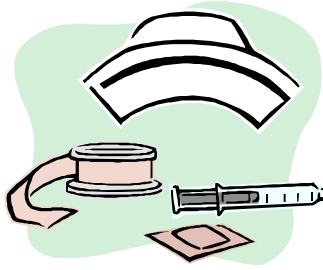
Who is a parish nurse (faith community nurse/congregational)?

A parish nurse (PN) is a registered nurse with a minimum of 2 years experience that works in a faith community to address health issues of its members and other members in the broader community or neighborhood. The experience the nurse has gathered working in other medical areas / specialties aids the nurse with assessment of health status, health needs, and collaboration with health agencies. What makes this specialty different is the conscious partnering of health issues with the faith of the client and client's family. The core to this practice is the intentional care of the spirit of those the PN assists.

What does a parish nurse do?

A parish nurse seeks to foster physical, emotional, spiritual, and social harmony leading to healthy and healing relationships with God, family, faith communities, culture and creation. They have several roles:

- **H** – Health advisor- Available to answer questions about medications, treatments, procedures, disease processes, etc.
- **E** – Educator on health issues- The nurse provides resources to educate the congregation and community on ways to stay healthy. The nurse has the resource of expert speakers, the printed information, and continues to add to her personal knowledge of the latest health care issues and makes these available to the faith community.
- **A** – Advocate/resource person
- **L** – Liaison to faith & community resources- The nurse knows the local resources and physicians and assists the congregation and others in knowing when to go to the doctor, what resources are available to assist them in self- care, how to get assistance in paying for health care and how to walk through the complicated maze of managed care.
- **T** – Teacher of volunteers & developer of support groups- The nurse helps identify and train volunteers to lead support groups, to assist with care, to assist with screening and use their gifts and training in an “whole-istic” way that expands the faith community’s ministry and honors God.
- **H** – Healer of body, mind, spirit, and community- The nurse may counsel a young, pregnant teenager and her parents, help people take their medicines correctly, assist an elderly person to make changes that will allow him to stay in his home, answer questions about upcoming treatment, visit those discharged from the hospital to assist in the adjustment, help a new mother understand self-care and child care or meet many other needs.
