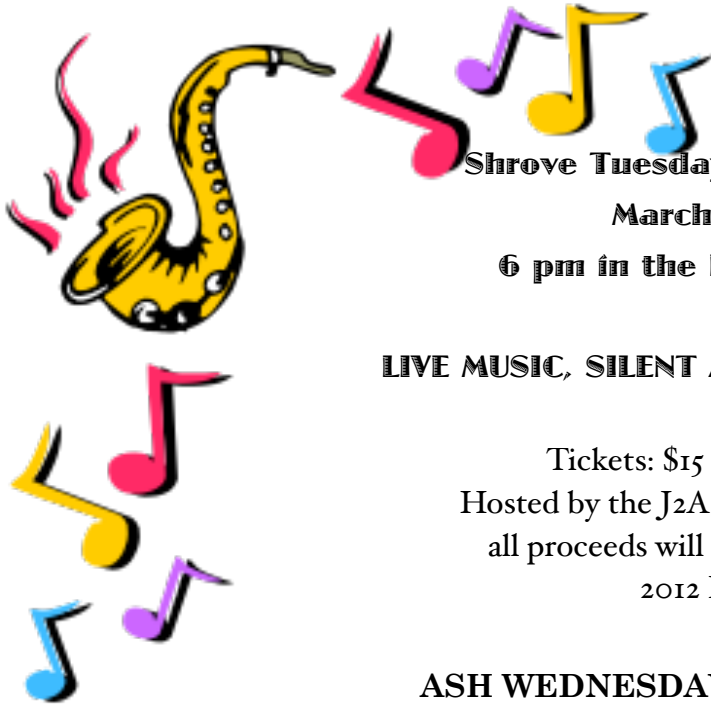

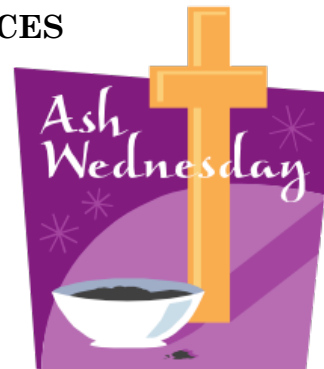

production assembly line to make
the dresses and britches Jeanne
Condrey showed us! This is a
product in great need.

Be sure to please bring your
sewing machine and/or serger to the
ECW meeting! You will also need
scissors, pins, measuring tape, a
pillowcase or 2/3 to 1 yard of
material (for a dress) OR 2/3 to 3/4
yard (for britches). The dress needs
1/2 yard of 1/2" or 3/4" wide elastic,
as well as 1 package of extra-wide,
double fold bias tape in a color to co-
ordinate with the fabric and thread
that goes with the fabric. The
britches need 5/8 yard of 3/4" to 1"
wide elastic, as well as thread that
co-ordinates with the fabric. Bring
any other items you like to use
when sewing!

Come prepared to have some
fun and make a pretty dress or
britches with our ECW members!

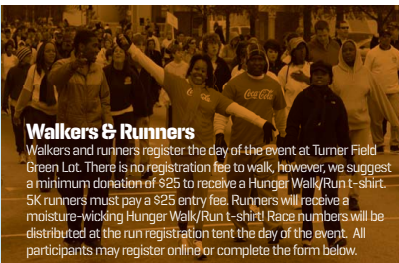
