This Wednesday evening at the Lenten soup/supper, a woman, Bobbye Jean Warford, spoke about the Carroll County Soup Kitchen. She was very complimentary of the role that St. Margaret's played in the formation of the Soup Kitchen twenty-four years ago. Like a number of others, I could not believe it was twenty-four years ago that our priest, Jim Callahan, reacting to the needs of the less fortunate, started the Soup Kitchen.

Bobby Jean said that last month, the Soup Kitchen gave out over 4000 lunches. If a person shows up, they get a hot meal and a bag containing three lunches to take home. So they served a minimum of 1000 people last month. She said that even though some people may not really need the food, they give the food to whomever comes; no effort is made to see if they are truly needy. That attitude was also that of Jim Callahan, and it is heartening to know it is continuing.

It reminded me of the time (only once I am sorry to say), that I helped Jim deliver pancakes and sausages which were left over from a breakfast sponsored by the Shriners. They knew of Jim's involvement in the Soup Kitchen, so when they called him about the leftovers, of course, Jim said he would give them out to those in need of food. I usually don't hang around the church much, but for some reason on that day I was there, and Jim asked me to help deliver them, which is probably why I don't hang around the church much. He explained that a number of people were low on food at the end of the month: food stamps had run out, etc., but also working families were struggling to make ends meet, and the end of the month was difficult for many.

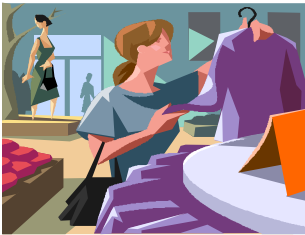
We picked up the breakfasts, packed in styrofoam containers to keep them warm, and headed out. Jim reiterated the need of many of the people right here in Carrollton for food. He then told me that the lady we would see first was big: she would need about three packages of pancakes. I expected to see a gaunt, 6' 5" woman with every rib showing, skinny arms and legs and barely having enough energy to open the door. When Jim got on her front porch, the door flung open and a booming voice called out, "Jimmy! It's so good to see you!" She looked about 5' 5", and appeared to weigh at least 250. I thought, "This woman could easily body-slam me."

They chatted briefly, and Jim said we had to go on as we wanted to deliver the rest of the pancakes while they were warm. She yelled as we left, "You come back now, Jimmy!"

I realized later Jim was not only feeding these people's bodies, but he was also nourishing their souls. Still later, I came across a quote from Mother McAuley, the founder of the Sisters of Mercy, the order of nuns who started St. Joseph's Hospital in Atlanta, who said, "It is better to believe one hundred imposters than to turn away one truly needy person." I thought of how that quote typified Jim Callahan and Barry Staples.

Like so many of us, I am guilty of not telling people how much I appreciate what they do for me, but today I would like to publicly thank Jim Callahan for his role in the formation of the Soup Kitchen, and to let him know that we at St. Margaret's are all very proud of him and the work he did while here.

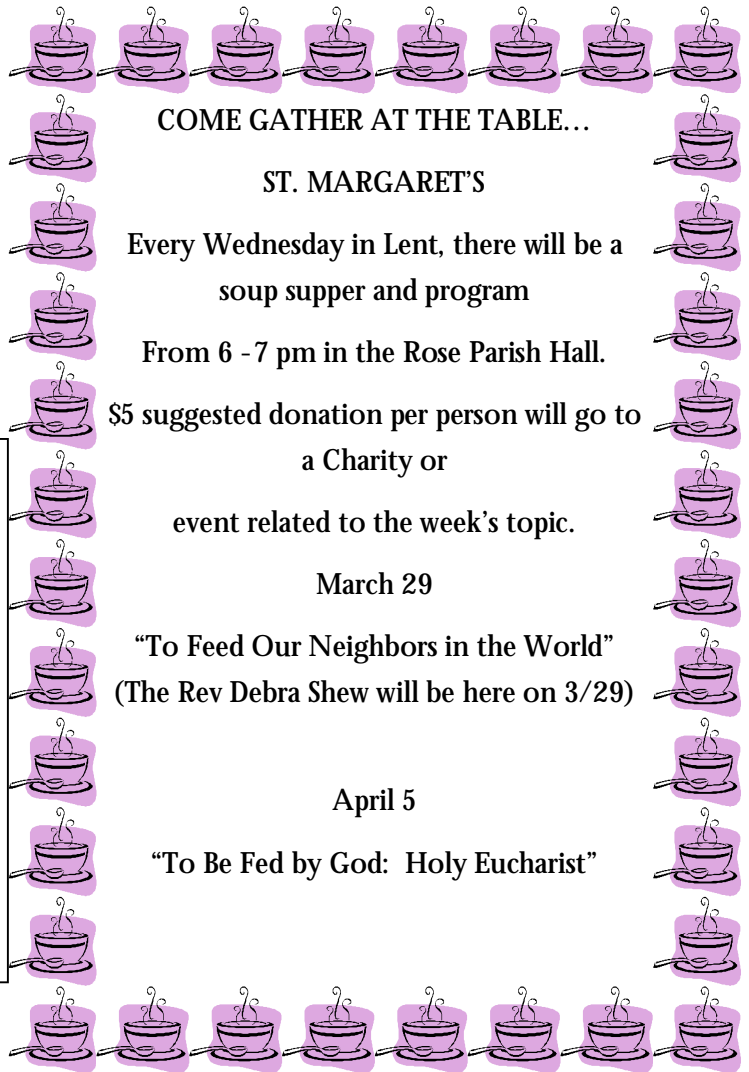

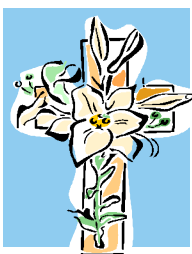
