## ***From the Rector***

A monk in his travels once found a precious stone and kept it. And the professor wrote his own letter.

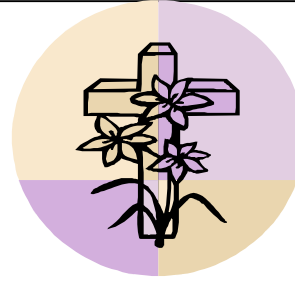
Ultimately a spiritual discipline developed

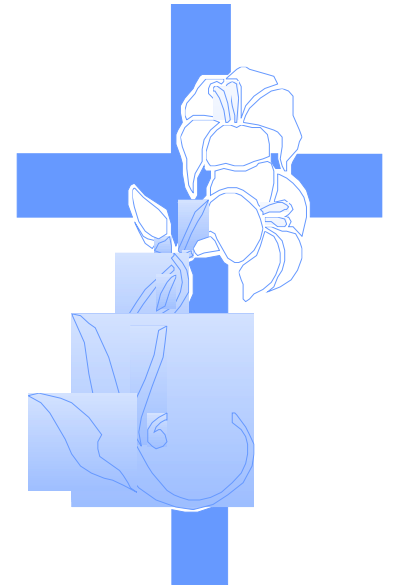

## PASTORAL CARE

These are exciting and challenging issue's for St. Margaret. We will make sure that all decisions are thought through and debated thoroughly. We will also communicate all issue's with the congregation to ensure buy-in from St. Margaret as a whole.

## glimpses of hope

. . . . a peek inside St. Margaret's Community Outreach . . .

Giving help. Sharing hope.

**March 2007**

*. . . make us instruments of your peace. . .*

A few weeks ago I got a call from a Carrollton businessman who had heard the SMCO presentation at an early-morning autumn Carroll County Sertoma Club meeting. He remembered the kinds of assistance SMCO provided and was seeking help for a family with whom he is acquainted. The family has experienced a series of unbelievably horrible events, including the murder/suicide of a daughter, her baby and boyfriend three years ago. A remaining daughter has survived a bout with cancer. Mom and Dad are both diabetic and Dad has experienced three heart attacks. The last attack kept him out of work for some time. While the family has had medical insurance, even the co-pays on prescription meds have made them have to choose which meds they would take. The cancer survivor daughter is in counseling, struggling with some emotional issues, possibly related to her discovery of the carnage of slaughtered family members when she was 9 or 10. When I got the call, the mom was not taking any of her diabetic meds, and the dad, who had just begun a new job with a trucking company in Atlanta, was only taking selective meds. The businessman/friend had helped to keep the electric service connected. The phone was disconnected for non-payment. The natural gas provider had also sent a disconnection notice. Dad's new job calls for him to leave the mom and daughter in the home in the very early hours, long before daylight. They are still a bit spooked by their experiences, but they have no way of placing a telephone call for help, if the need were to arise. Can you help?

I met with the surprisingly pleasant woman and pledged to help as much as we could. Within a few days, we had a 30-day supply of all the essential meds to them. While SMCO was working the medical angle, our businessman friend sent an e-mail to fellow Sertomans and other business associates, briefly explaining the situation and inviting help. They could help this family anonymously, with a directed tax-deductible donation to SMCO. Within a few days, two donations directed toward this family were received. Shortly, a third donation was received. Currently, the phone is reconnected. The gas account is off the disconnect list. The Sertomans didn't do it all. The other business associates didn't do it all. SMCO didn't do it all. We did it together. *One helped the other help another. One's money made the other's money go further. Now that's what I call **community**. Our work continues.*

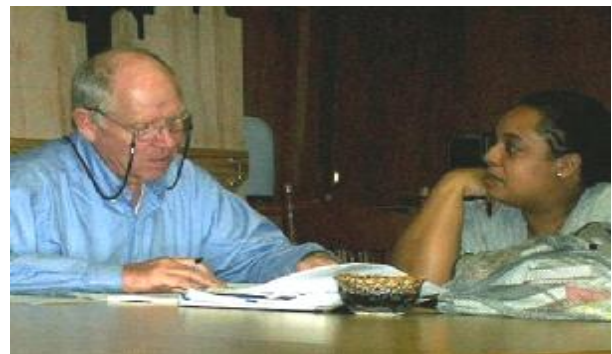

We’ll be back to Apartment E4, Lakeview-Paradise, to water and love all the living things we left there, taking root and growing.

SMCO was recently paid a “site visit” from the Episcopal Charities Foundation. The purpose for the visit was for the ECF board member assigned to SMCO to interview SMCO’s director, evaluate our program and determine whether or not we should be recommended to receive the monetary grant for which we have applied. One Outreach Director was just a little nervous, the butterflies fluttering in my belly, anxious to accurately portray our SMCO to this representative from our larger Episcopal family.

My nervousness evaporated instantly when I met our visitor. From the moment we shook hands, I knew she “got it.” Her questions were such a pleasure to answer because I got to boast - on you, St. Margaret’s people. She asked about our mission and was impressed with your continuing commitment to our original mission. She asked about our money and was impressed with the level of financial commitment of our members. She asked about our manpower and was impressed with the numbers of volunteers who turn the wheels of this operation, applying the money and pursuing the mission.

I felt like a grandmother must feel, bragging on you and your success, sharing memories of our past and plans for our future. As my eldest son understands and states so eloquently, “This Outreach is bigger than any one of us,” but every one of us is a vital part of the mix.

The more I explained the roles of volunteers in our organization to our visitor from Episcopal Charities, the more “grandmotherly” I felt, wanting every one of you to be acknowledged for your

contributions. Alice and the Paper Pantry Crew, from St. Margaret’s and the community. Tanner Medical Center. The Homework Helper Team, from St. Margaret’s, the University of West Georgia, Carroll County 4-H and my own extended family. George. Rose and the ECW (and ECMen) and all those who so graciously pitched in to make the Valentine Luncheon such a splendid affair. The ECW and its on-going support, before, during and after the Valentine Luncheon. Hazel. Julie. Laura. The folks at St. Margaret’s I can call on any time for any service. Fred. Jeanette. Liz.
