The Work of Our Hands Artists Market, which annually benefits the Emmaus House Community Art Project and Friendship House Art Center at the Church of the Holy Comforter, is moving to the Cathedral of St. Philip and runs Nov. 20-23.

Nearly 100 local and regional artists are participating in a show and sale that will include pottery, weaving, woodturning, painting, stained glass, photography, jewelry, quilts, cards, wood carving, Christmas ornaments and many other handmade and original gifts in a variety of price ranges. The event will also feature the works of several Emmaus House and Friendship House artists.

The opening reception is from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. Thursday, Nov. 20. The show and sale continue the following day from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., Saturday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Sunday from 9 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.

The nonprofit organization known as The Work of Our Hands was founded by Bishop Frank K. Allan upon his retirement in 2000 as the eighth bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Atlanta. A devoted wood-turner and believer in the spiritual and therapeutic benefits of creating art, Bishop Allan sought to build an organization to support these local, art-oriented missions of the Atlanta diocese, which serve underprivileged and mentally disabled children, adults and seniors in the Peoplestown and Reynoldstown neighbor-

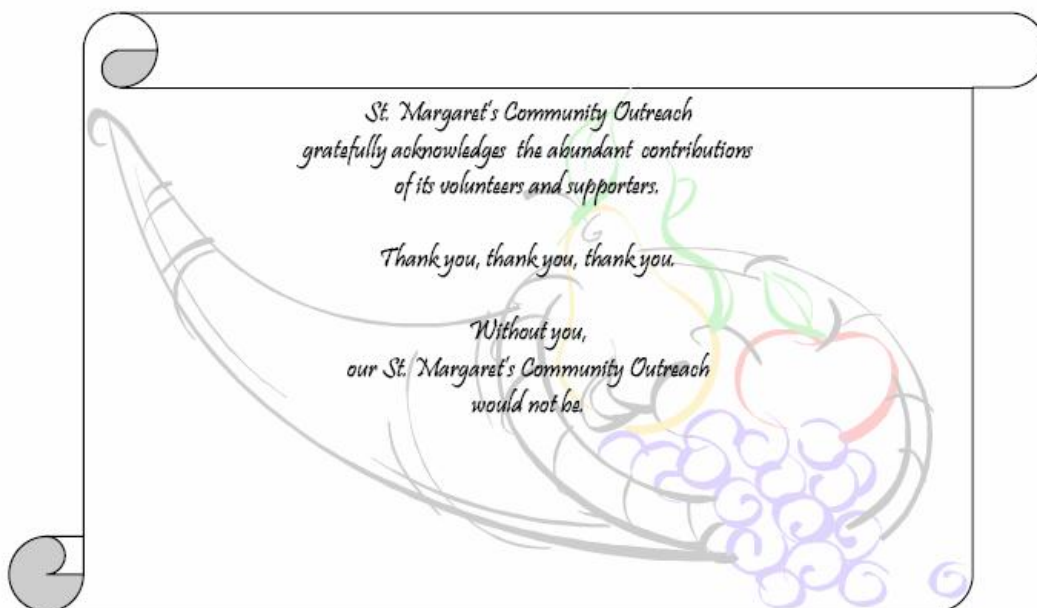

History and Mission: *St. Margaret's Outreach began in 1991 at St. Margaret's Episcopal Church in Carrollton, Georgia at the hand of the late Father James Callahan with a generous founding endowment by The Roy Richards, Jr. Foundation for Charitable Giving. Inspired by the church's matron saint, Margaret, Queen of Scots, and her compassion for the poor, Father Callahan had already established the 600 block of Newnan Street, Carrollton, as a sort of refuge for those in need. He challenged the late Barry M. Staples, attorney, community activist and school teacher, to design and implement a ministry of compassion to the local poor. The ministry quickly grew beyond the boundaries of St. Margaret's Episcopal Church into the community. In 1995, the National Episcopal Church designated St. Margaret's Outreach a Jubilee Center, that is, an exemplary ministry to the poor. Over the years, SMCO has forged numerous alliances and partnerships throughout the area, fostering a working philosophy of "collaborative ministry." These alliances and partnerships include churches, schools, local hospital, housing and service providers, governmental agencies, civic organizations, businesses, families and individuals. The current St. Margaret's Community Outreach (SMCO) is supported by St. Margaret's Episcopal Church and the community. Its mission remains consistent with the mission of the original organization: to provide for the unmet needs of the poor and disadvantaged throughout Carroll County and beyond without discrimination as to race, religion, color, creed or national origin.*

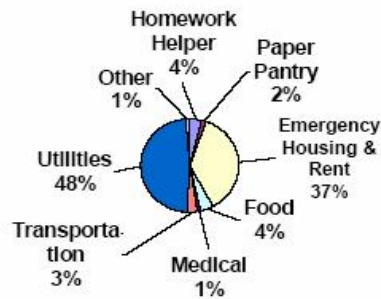

Back and forth, back and forth. Two weekly rides to school, two rides home. All set. Our friend, who has made substantial progress since she resumed her GED program in July, remains completely dependent on our volunteers for the "to and fro" transport. Two of our boldest helpers have accepted the assignment, one helper taking on both weekly morning deliveries, the other helping with an afternoon pick-up. That has left one transportation leg for me. After we pack in Homework Helper on Tuesday afternoons, I fly to West Central Tech to pick up our friend from her school day which began shortly after ten that morning and take her home – a long day for both of us. I am usually ready to call it a day and get home. Very ready. Unfailingly, when our friend gets into my car, she looks squarely at me and asks how I am. She waits for me to say. She brings back the pleasure of the weekend past by asking what I did. She shares her weekend happenings too, always a bit more dramatic than my own. She remembers things I have told her. She asks questions about my life. She shares her life. She shares her dreams. She looks like a school girl, occasionally in need of a fashion tip, but trying - trying harder than she tried in July. Her last evaluation at school indicated her progress. She still has a long way to go, but we applaud her progress. All any of us can do is stick to our guns and try. She offered me some candy after Halloween. I politely refused, but she insisted I take it by leaving it in my car. I gave her some hand-me-down running shoes. "They're beautiful. Thank you," she said. Beautiful, yes - not the shoes, but the fact that our SMCO can be the vehicle for her journey forward. How strangely perfect that we share the same enormous shoe size. Beautiful is her pace, slowing me to savor what is good. Touch and be touched. Motivate and be motivated. Transport and be transported.
