While dusting off old photos I found a shot of Anne Norrell and Mike Erwin on the date of my installation as your rector.

I also rediscovered notes our "now grown up" youth written to me after my first Sunday in 2002.

I've been leafing through pages of books I used in seminary and some Jim Callahan used in seminary

I am saying with a grin words like "eschatological" and "epistemology."

The sifting process fills me with deep joy and gratitude for past and future memories in this place now called "The Gable House."

As you know the Gable House was named for a former rector,

The Rev. Dewey Gable, who was here in the early 1950s as the church was being built.

Dewey brought the stone from the holy ruins of Iona, Scotland that is embedded in our altar as a tangible link to St. Margaret, Queen of Scots.

In 11th century Scotland, Queen Margaret was known for her love of the church and her commitment to orphans and the poor. True to her legacy St. Margaret's Community Outreach was birthed during the tenure of The Rev. Jim Callahan twenty years ago.

As we move forward to rebuilt the building which has housed St. Margaret's Community Outreach, offices, and other program spaces for our parish, we are wondering out loud about a name.

"New Gable House" just doesn't fit the bill.

My mind keeps returning to the name "Callahan."

WHAT IS EMPTY PET

BOWLS (EPB)? EPB is designed to provide help for struggling pet owners in Carroll County who are having financial problems feeding their pets. The program will provide food for up to three animals for up to a year. (These with more animals can ask for an exception, and we are very lenient)

The food is distributed a month at a time. Pet owners can obtain a month's supply of food each time they make a request but must wait a month to get more.

HOW DO I OBTAIN FOOD? Food is distributed to individuals receiving assistance at the Manna House and is also available on a regular basis at the Carroll County Animal Shelter. Those needing assistance can come to the shelter during regular business hours (M-Sat 8-5) and make a request, which shelter staff will fulfill on our behalf.

Thrift Shop Clean up - Monday, November 7 at 10:00am.

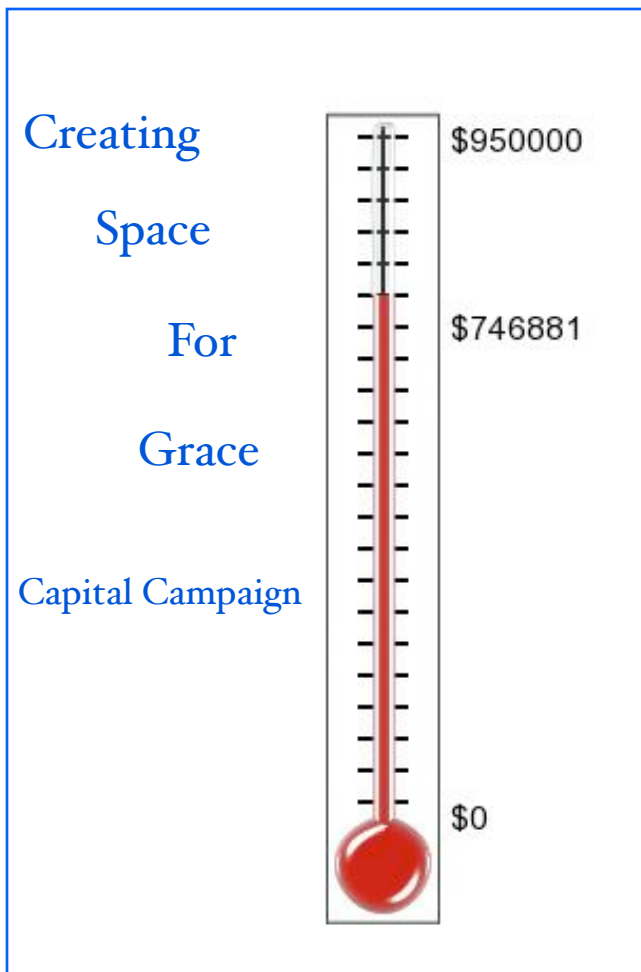
ECW will meet on Tuesday, November 8 at 12 noon in the parish hall.
