From the rector:

Of all the Holy Days in the church year,

All Saints Day is one that cuts to my heart and soul.

I rejoice in the assurance that we are knitted together in the mystical body of Christ on earth and in heaven.

At the core of our faith is the assurance that

death cannot separate us from the love of God  
or even from the love of family and friends.

At times we can be acutely aware of the presence of

“angels and archangels and all the company of heaven.”

I'm not talking about chunky cherubs flying around with halos  
but a deep and real sense of someone who has died -  
a presence wrapped in holiness.

I tell the story often of celebrating Eucharist at a funeral in my home parish.

It was one of the few times I had been back home since ordination.

A woman approached me after the service to say

“Hazel, I saw your mom standing next to you during the Eucharist.  
You know you're looking more like her the older you get.”

Recently, I was invited into the hospital room of a family (I did not know)  
gathered around their father's death bed.

Their mother had died a few years earlier.

At that time they had been married for 53 years.

His daughter said, “Mom has been here all day.

Dad has been talking to her for years. But we know that she is here right now.”

On All Saints Sunday we will name out loud

the names of those we love, but see no longer.

We will thank God for giving them to us

to know and to love on our earthly pilgrimage.

We will celebrate their lives – both on earth and in heaven.

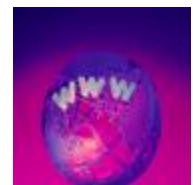

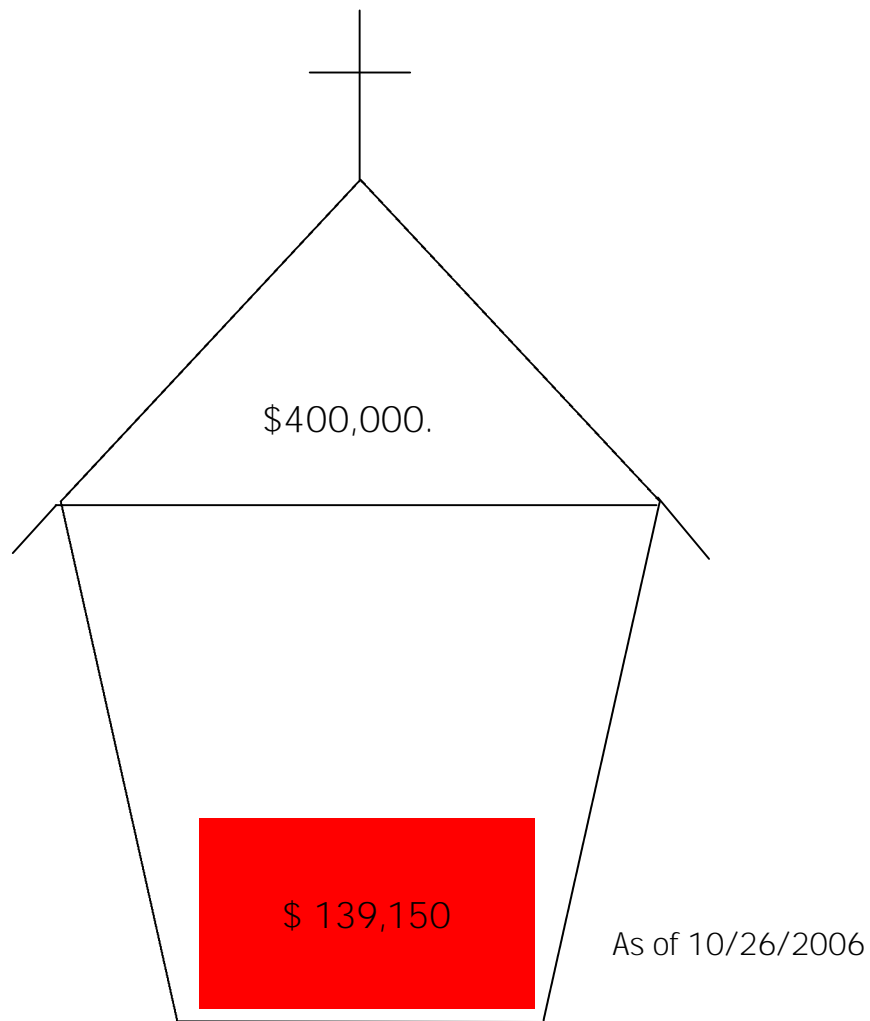

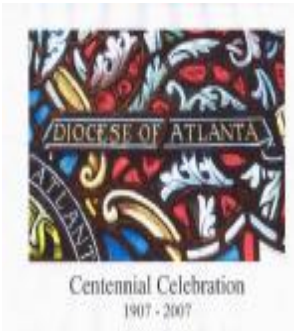

We have welcomed hundreds of neighbors and friends onto the church grounds for to shop and take pictures in the patch. We've talked to each other – meeting new friends and reconnected with old ones.



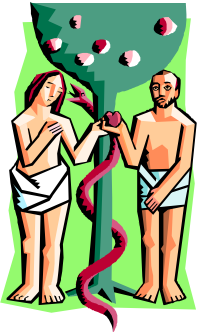
Friends from UWG, the brothers of Pi Kappa Phi helped get us off to a quick start when the pumpkins arrived by helping us unload the truck. Since then, we've passed our hundreds of stickers and shared even more hellos with visitors to the patch. In the morning hours, we have hosted nearly three hundred students from six schools in the area; reading them stories, painting their faces and sending them off with a pumpkin and a smile.

We put the pumpkins to bed, woke them up in the morning and sent a few out to an early end in the "pumpkin pit". This week, more UWG students, the sisters of Delta Delta Delta shoring us up by volunteering in the patch and helping us sell the final 200 pumpkins we have left. Sales to date are nearly \$8000.00 and we fully expect to sell out our remaining stock before Halloween arrives on Tuesday.

Thank you to each of you who gave your support, time and effort to make this event such a success. Keep sending your friends our way so that we can finish out the patch with strong sales and be sure to come out in costume Sunday afternoon for the annual All Hallows Eve party from 4 – 5 pm. Watch the bulletin next week for the final tally on profit.

## Did You Know He Was an Episcopalian?

Franklin Delano Roosevelt (January 30, 1882–April 12, 1945).

Thirty-second President of the United States, 1933-1945. He was the leader of the United States in the face of the Great Depression and World War II. Roosevelt was baptized at St. James' Episcopal Church, Hyde Park, New York, and later served as senior warden of St. James'. He was elected to the New York State Senate in 1910 and appointed Assistant Secretary of the Navy in 1913. Roosevelt was stricken with poliomyelitis in 1921, but his illness did not prevent his career of public service. He was elected governor of New York in 1928, and reelected in 1930. He was elected president in 1932 and inaugurated in 1933. In his first inauguration address as president he urged that "the only thing we have to fear is fear itself."

He sought to counter the ravages of the Depression with a sweeping economic program known as the New Deal. Roosevelt was also the first president to appoint a woman, Frances Perkins, as a member of the Cabinet. Before the United States entered World War II, Roosevelt provided assistance to Great Britain and its allies through the Lend-Lease Act. He also denied war supplies to Japan. As President of the United States during World War II, Roosevelt played a leading role in creating the alliance with Great Britain and the Soviet Union. He was reelected president in 1936, 1940, and 1944.
